COLUMNIST LIKES THE CLIMATE HERE

Praise to the climate of Del Monte and the Monterey peninsula was given this week in Bruno Lessing's column which tributes in the San Francisco Examiner and 200 other newspapers in the country.

Writing of his cross country trip and the heat on the train, Lessing says:

"So I went out on the rear platform and chatted with the brakeman. He pointed out an endless row of vegetation.

"Apricots," he said. "Pears. Lettuce. Tomatoes. Oranges." He named all the fruits and vegetables in the calendar. I had an attack of hyperacidity. And then, with a suddenness that was like a blow in the face, the air became cool and a great wave of relief swept over me. At the same moment the car porter called out "Del Monte!"

"That's remarkable," said I. The brakeman turned his head of chewing gum over in his mouth. "It's always like this when you get to Del Monte," he said. "The heat wave always stops here."

INDEPENDENT MOVIES SEIZED IN RAID

Six reels of obscene motion pictures were confiscated and two men were arrested last night when Monterey police raided a hall at Pearl and Alvarado streets where the films were being shown. About a hundred men, mostly fishermen, were in the audience.

Charles Zukinski, 33, Concord, Calif., who admitted ownership of the pictures, claimed that they were being exhibited as an "educational" feature to raise funds for war veterans when arranged before Police Judge Monty Hellam.

The American Legion and other organizations however today emphatically denied Zukinski's statement. Zukinski pleaded not guilty to a charge of exhibiting indecent pictures when arraigned before Judge Hellam last night. He changed his plea to guilty this morning, however, after he had spent the night in jail because of failure to post \$250 bail.

Arrested with Zukinski was Arthur Reina, 31, 328 Barclay Avenue, Pacific Grove, charged with operation of the projection machine used to show the pictures.

Zukinski was fined \$250 and Reina \$50 by Judge Hellam this morning. Both paid their fines. The films confiscated by police were ordered destroyed.
