I think it would be advisable to eliminate use of
asbestos blankets whenever possible, and this might become
required by law in years to come. By all means, I would urge
the use of masks for the cutting and the handling of all asbestos
material. I would certainly regard the elimination of all
asbestos material whenever possible as important.

Our Engineering Department told me that they are
already engaged in a study of insulating materials, and are
urging substitutes whenever possible. Perhaps your Engineering
Department is already aware of this. //
