Almost all of the nation's servicemen have a chance to use a special government savings system which probably pays a higher interest than any other they could find.

The System — established by Congress more than 50 years ago — is open to all men in the armed services except those in the Coast Guard.

In the Army these accounts are called Soldier's Deposits. In the Air Force they're Altimin's Deposits. In the Navy and Marine Corps, Savings Deposits.

The purpose of the system is to give servicemen a chance to build up a nest egg while in uniform and to make the deposit of personal funds as easy as possible.

If you're a member of the Armed Forces, and you make deposits in any even dollar amount from \$1 on up. They must be made in cash — no checks, money orders or the like. There is no way to have these deposits made through deductions from your pay.

To make the deposits in the Army and Air Force, all you have to do is hand the cash over to your personnel officer. In the Navy and Marine Corps, your disbursing officer will take care of the deposits.

INTEREST

Although your deposits will begin to earn interest immediately at the rate of 4 per cent a year, you can't collect the interest until they have been in your account for six months.

The four per cent interest is considerably higher than that paid on U.S. Savings Bonds and on savings accounts at most banks or building and loan associations. The interest on savings bonds is slightly less than 3 per cent, and the best that most savings or building and loan accounts pay is around 2 per cent.

Suppose you deposited \$100 in the service deposits. The interest for one year would be \$4. If you invested the same amount in savings bonds, the interest would be \$3, and it would be about \$2 on savings bank or building and loan deposits.

There's only one drawback to putting money into the service deposit system. It isn't easy to withdraw.

The service deposits can't be withdrawn unless one of these things happen:

1. You're transferred to inactive status, retired from service or discharged, providing your discharge was not the result of dishonorable. (If you desert you lose all right to your savings and interest.)

2. You complete a three-year period of any enlistment originally scheduled to run for more than three years.

3. You die, in which case the money will go to the person you have designated.

4. You're confronted with an emergency that will endanger the
