Dear Doctor Kehoe:

Urine and blood samples were taken on [REDACTED] ABC-226,
on July 30, 1943.

The utmost caution was observed in obtaining these. The man came to the Plant on his own time in his street clothes. At the Hospital, he took a thorough shower with hot water and soap. He was immediately placed on a stretcher on a clean sheet and covered with another clean sheet. Blood was then withdrawn with the utmost care.

A urine was obtained immediately after the blood sample. Before reporting to the Hospital, the patient limited his fluids from midnight to nine A.M. in order to obtain a more concentrated urine.

We await with interest the report of your findings on this man. We would appreciate a comment as to whether the high blood and low urine lead concentrations could be influenced by excessive intake of water during the hot weather.
