The containers arrived in good condition and so I am shipping you some soil samples express collect. I am sorry to say that these are all the samples which I can spare at the present time. In order to show you how closely I have cut my collection in order to give you samples of the soils, I am giving below a list of the samples shipped, together with the amount shipped and the amount in my collection before shipment.

The above weights are not exact but are very close. You can see from this that I could not spare you any more, as all of the other countries in my collection are represented by much smaller amounts of soil.

As I said in a previous letter I intend to import some more soil. Some of it is already on the way. As soon as I have sufficient number to make a package worth shipping, I will notify you. Also, in the future, I will request a larger amount of soil, so that I may send some to you.
