Dear Doctor Train:

I have read with a great deal of interest your unusual case report, and believe the patient must have been suffering from a severe virus infection of the central nervous system, producing a widespread acute poliomyelencephalitis. I know of no beneficial treatment for the residual paralyses aside from the usual physiotherapeutic measures, and am wondering if he might not be helped by a sojourn at Warm Springs.

Because of the unusual features of the case, and the unanimity of opinion of the doctors consulted, that the condition was due to lead poisoning, I have asked Dr. Kehoe to write to you regarding this particular phase of the case.

I am glad you still remember us here in Cincinnati, and recall with great pleasure my sojourn with you last year.
