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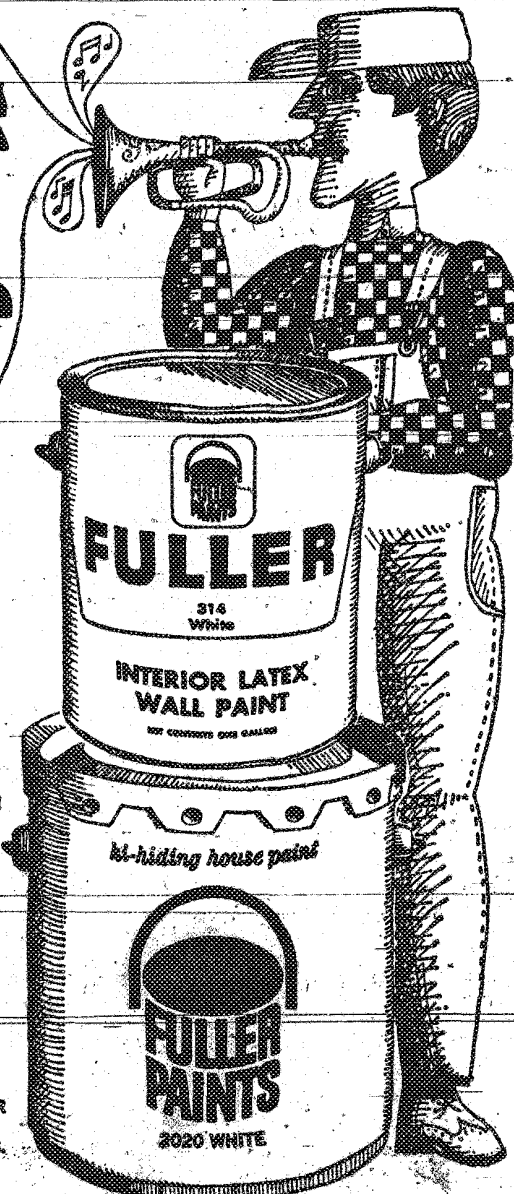

In the opening night, Allied down 5-0 go of the second, a pair on sin Owen Loftus

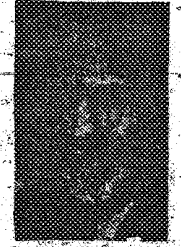
