Deputy Administrator for Lead Code.

Protest signature of last draft lead code issued February 6 as practically valueless. Stop. Contains no production and sales provisions comparable to those of copper code issued February 12. Stop As issued lead code in effect is a build up for National Lead Company whose avaricious price policies have destroyed market for approximately fifty per cent pig lead production. Stop Recommend National Lead be compelled to reduce prices white lead one third to one half in order to stimulate consumption latest paint demand enormous but strangled by prohibitive price. Stop. The undersigned also represent substantial commercial units.
