AT FAMILY PICNIC

PLEASANTON, April 27.—An outing planned by the David A. Jordan family, 1804 Derby street, Berkeley, ended in a tragedy yesterday when little Jack R. Jordan, 2-year-old son of the couple, wandered away from where the family was enjoying lunch and was drowned in a pool less than a foot deep.

The baby was discovered by an autoist who was driving over the bridge near Sunol. Glancing toward the Sunol grammar school grounds the body of the child was seen in the water. Mrs. Jordan was within 100 feet of the pool but it was hidden from her by a rise in the ground. The baby had not been missed and only wandered from the mother's side a few moments before.

Dr. J. Hall Cope, local physician, attempted to resuscitate the little one with a pulmotor but his efforts proved unavailing.

Mother-in-Law Sued For \$200,000 Damage

CHICAGO, April 27.—(P)—Suit for \$200,000 for alienation of affections was filed here today by Mrs. Gladys McCormick-Goodhart, the English wife of F. Hamilton McCormick-Goodhart, against her mother-in-law, Mrs. Nettie McCormick-Goodhart, who now lives in Washington.

Only the praecipe of the suit was filed with the full facts to be set forth in a declaration to be filed next June, attorneys said.

In the name McCormick-Goodhart is represented the linking of one of Chicago's oldest families with that of a British barrister. F. Hamilton McCormick-Goodhart was born in England and is a British subject.

School Boy, Shot At Class Play, Dies

OKLAHOMA CITY, April 27.—The accidental shooting of Thomas Leslie, 18, in a class play of the high school of Wayne, Okla., during a rehearsal last Thursday, proved fatal today.

Despite blood transfusions given by classmates of the youth, his condition failed to improve.

Young Leslie was struck near the spine by the welding from a blank cartridge fired at him by the "villain" of the play.

Five Men Die in Coal Mine Gas Blast

WEST NEWTON, Pa., April 27.—Five workers were killed in an explosion which wrecked the Westmoreland Coal Company mine at Mill Cove, near here.

Bodies of four men who were entombed by the blast were found in the workings early today by a rescue squad from the Bureau of Mines headquarters at Pittsburgh. The fifth victim was killed at the entrance of the mine when the explosion occurred last night.



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
