first \$2000 above the exemption would be 6 percent. To both the normal and surtaxes an additional 10 percent defense surtax would be added, making the effective rate for the normal tax 4.4 and for the starting surtax 6.6.

The treasury plan would levy a system of surtaxes starting at 11 percent (12.1 including super-tax) on all income in excess of personal exemptions (\$500 for single persons, \$2000 for married couples and \$400 for each dependent) and in excess of such items as interest, tax payments and contributions to church or charity.

As in the case of the joint committee plan, the treasury surtax would be in addition to the normal.

One point of difference with the treasury plan was that the joint committee would not allow subtraction of the personal exemptions prior to applying the surtax but would allow a \$2000 specific exemption.

Found Unconscious Following Overdose of Sleep Potion.

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif., April 23. (AP)—Arabella Hayes Hartley, 23-year-old model and motion picture actress known professionally as Bunny Hartley, was recovering tonight from what police records stated was an overdose of a sedative.

Police Officers James Harp and A. B. Cox said they found the actress lying semiconscious on the floor of her apartment last midnight after they received a telephone call from a man at Richmond, Va., asking that they investigate.

At Norfolk, Va., her father, Lieut. Commander Howard W. Hartley, USN, said he had not telephoned the local police.

The officers said they found three notes in Miss Hartley's apartment, one of them addressed to her former husband, James Barry Feeley, 32, in Chicago.
