Today on Climate Beat . . .

. . . we went on the road again, reporting that California's legislative leaders are delaying a vote on their cap-and-trade bill until July 17, hoping to use the additional time to convince Gov. Jerry Brown to support unrelated housing legislation.

Also, the American Coalition for an Energy-Efficient Economy is urging policymakers to preserve the tractor trailer requirements in EPA's final phase 2 truck greenhouse gas rule, arguing that the first-time regulation of trailers in the Obama-era rule is key to improving long-haul truck efficiency.

In Congress, the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee on a party-line vote approved the nomination of Susan Bodine to head EPA's enforcement office, with Democrats continuing to express broader concerns about the willingness of agency officials to respond to their oversight requests.

And our daily news roundup looked at key exchanges in a wide-ranging interview EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt gave to Reuters, including EPA's authority to regulate greenhouse gases, its negotiation with California on vehicle GHG standards and his reaction to the agency's recent court loss over its bid to pause oil and gas methane standards.
