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Gentlemen:

On August 29, 1968, a visit was made to the plant of R. E. Kramig & Co., Inc. at Cincinnati, Ohio to check conditions under which the claimant had worked.

The company is a contractor for insulation installation.

According to the company's records, the claimant's experience with this company is as follows:

4-23-61 to 12-31-61 Laid off at end of job.

5-16-62 to 7-22-62 " " " " " "

2-4-68 to Claimant is now working.

Time not stated as working for above company represents time spent with other contractors.

Claimant was a union journeyman mechanic. Claimant was sent out on a job by the Union (Asbestos Workers Local #8) at call from contractor. Claimant was never seen in the office of the company. Pay checks were mailed to his home or given to the claimant on the job. The company, by contract, could not subject claimant to a pre-employment physical examination. Also, claimant's prior employment is unknown to the company. Same can be secured from O.D. 123638.

Claimant was an installer. He received three foot lengths or standard blocks of insulation on the job. Claimant did the "cut to fit" sizing in the field by the use of a knife or hand saw. Very little dust was generated. The company has only one power saw for the installation but claimant never worked on these jobs.

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
