See below a [copy](#) of EPA's report outlining the actions EPA administrator Scott Pruitt spearheaded in his first year to clear backlogs across the agency (FOIA, new chemical reviews, SIPs, Superfund decisions, etc.) and save the American people **\$1 billion in regulatory costs**.

To date, accomplishments include:

- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->**DE-REG:** EPA announced it would not finalize duplicative and unnecessary hardrock mining regulations under CERCLA
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->**AIR:** Repealed CPP and returned power to the states by turning one Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) into a State Implementation Plan (SIP) each month; EPA's air office also ended "once in, always in"
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->**WATER:** EPA rescinded the overreaching "Waters of the U.S." rule and cut the amount of time it took to review state water quality standards in half (from 120 to 60)
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->**LAND:** Seven sites were removed from the NPL list last year, and – after decades of inaction, EPA put forth a plan to clean up the West Lake Landfill, a dumping ground for radioactive waste from the Manhattan Project.
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->**CHEMICALS:** EPA is successfully meeting the deadlines set forth in the Lautenberg Chemical Safety Act, including clearing the new chemical backlog, releasing a fees rule and framework rules on prioritization, risk evaluation and inventory.
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->**ENFORCEMENT:** In FY17, \$1.6 billion was collected in administrative and judicial penalties, higher than any of the previous 10 years, other than the year that included one \$5.6 billion action taken.
