Thank you for your letter of March 9, advising us of the status of the report which you are preparing for the Special Committee in Washington. We shall be most happy to have four (4) copies of your report, which I suggest you address to me and I shall distribute them to the proper people in our organization.

Ten days ago, I called Henry Doyle to find out what progress the Committee had made in reaching a recommendation to pass on to the Surgeon General, and he told me that he had received word from one or two members of the Committee, but that he had to prod the others to get them to move up with their reports. He did indicate, however, that his discussions with the various members have led him to believe that none were violently opposed to the request to go to a higher TEL level, so I presume it is largely a matter of being patient before hearing what the outcome will be.

The subject of lead alkyls still is a very active one, and we are looking forward to receiving your report on this subject. Dr. Zapp's work has progressed to a point where he believes the next step involves checking beyond the laboratory. In this connection, we may wish to contact you in the near future.
