Dear Mr. Beckman:-

In accordance with our telephone conversation, I am writing to bring to your attention the matter of our as yet unpublished article on the experimental study made of men engaged in the insulation of houses with Eagle Picher rock wool. In view of the fact that this study is of interest and importance in the field of occupational hygiene, I feel that it should be published for the information of other workers in this field. Moreover since the results obtained demonstrate that no significant health hazards exist in this occupation, it would also be advantageous in relation to commercial interests of Eagle Picher. I should suppose that the only question at issue is whether or not the Geismar case has been permanently disposed of. If it has been disposed of, I should like to be so informed in order that this article may be prepared for publication.
