I dare say some action will be forthcoming on the report
to the API, although as a committee they are likely to move slowly.
It strikes me as a trifle odd that they do not have a full time
coordinator for their toxicological work in view of its scope and
distribution.

Nothing has yet arisen to affect our understandings and
relationships and I hope to see you before too long to give you a
fill-in on the present set-up. My responsibilities center largely
around problems of mobilization and assignment of scientific per-
sonnel in which field we are moving ahead slowly. Our progress
naturally is greatly affected by the status of the war and public
attitude on mobilization.
