BUCHAREST, Rumania, Oct. 28 (U.P.)—Crown Prince Michael took his seat in the senate yesterday, on the occasion of his coming of age on his 18th birthday.

He now becomes full heir to the throne, and would rule the country in his own person, without regents, if he succeeded his father, King Carol.

Michael at 18 automatically enters into the country's political life. He already is a lieutenant in the army and navy.

EFFECT. An airways executive just back from a tour of British aircraft plants discloses that air-raid scares have reduced plant production by a fourth. The assembly units, he reports, have been camouflaged and made partly bomb-proof. Shelters for the workers adjoin each building.

There have been no bombings to date but numerous instances in which German patrols came near enough for raid warnings. Until defense planes and observation stations report all clear the plants are deserted. The real delay lies in the fact that stoppage of assembly lines requires an hour's time before it can be synchronized again. Time lost is triple that spent in the dugouts.

The suspicion is developing that the Germans have hit upon the cheapest and safest type of "bombing" yet devised.

Olive Drab

WASHINGTON, Oct. 28 (AP)—The doughboys will continue to march in olive drab. Those pretty blue uniforms some of them have been wearing on trial could be seen too easily by an enemy.

The test of the blues has not been entirely without result, however.

Secretary of War Woodring announced today that while retaining the olive drab color the army will adopt the design of the tested uniforms to provide greater comfort for the men. Long trousers will replace breeches, and shoulders of shirts and coats will be cut to fit more loosely.

Woodring said that tests by troops at 15 scattered posts showed the olive drab shade was better adapted to camouflage than the slate blue "for all-weather, all-year-round wear, and for all types of terrain."

But there was "no doubt," he said of the "superiority of the slate blue uniform's design."

The blues were tested by troops at Fort Bliss, Tex., Madison Barracks, N. Y., Fort Francis E. Warren, Wyo., Fort Sheridan, Ill., and Fort George Meade, Md.

S.F. Claims More People Than L.A.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 26 (AP)—Los Angeles note: the San Francisco chamber of commerce announced today that there was a bigger population, contrary to popular belief, in the 450 square mile area surrounding this city than in the same total area occupied by Los Angeles.

The chamber's announcement said:

"A careful estimate by the chamber reveals that the estimated 1939 population within the strip of land around the bay, extending from Palo Alto on the south to Vallejo on the north, amounts to 1,521,000 compared to the 1939 population estimate of 1,360,000 for the comparable 450 square miles of Los Angeles."
