Dear Scott:

First, I just wanted to thank you for volunteering to mentor a young Dartmouth grad via the new Dartmouth Center for Service Bridges to Impact program.

The good news is we had a large crop of mentor volunteers with super career experiences; and at this point I've assigned mentors to all of our "Bridgers" class of 2017 cohort (19 of them!). Three have environment related career ambitions. We simply had more excellent mentor volunteers with solid career backgrounds in that area than we have mentees.

I'm wondering now whether it would be OK if I shared your email address and career background with those three environment focused participants (who have primary mentors assigned)?
