Cummings, in January, 1852, and, later in the same year, started for California, crossing the plains with ox teams. They settled in San Jose until 1857 when they moved to Columbia, Tuolumne county, keeping for some six years, when they moved to San Francisco where they lived until the husband's death in 1891, and where she continued to reside until about two and a half years ago when she came to Ventura making her home with her nephew E. P. Foster. She died at the Elizabeth Bard hospital Friday morning, April 13, 1906. Thus passes another one of California's pioneers to whom the present and succeeding generations owe a larger debt of gratitude than they will ever be able to pay."
