Per our telephone conversation today, I am enclosing the papers from the claim of June 7, 1971. Mr. [REDACTED] has worked for the MacGregor Lead Company since January 12, 1966. After the acquisition of MacGregor Lead Company by the American Cyanamid Company, June 1, 1971, blood lead testing was instituted. On June 7, 1971 the first blood lead tests were taken and it was determined that Mr. [REDACTED] had a high blood lead count. At this point, Mr. [REDACTED] voluntarily went on vacation and once he had exhausted his vacation time, was placed on disability.

On August 10, 1971, our local doctor, Dr. Philip Falk, after consulting with Dr. Norley, of our medical department, released Mr. [REDACTED] to return to work. Since that time Mr. [REDACTED] has worked without interruption due to lead absorption. He is being monitored on a bi-monthly basis. This is standard procedure for employees with readings at .070 or below.

You may wish to contact Dr. Norley of our medical department for his opinion on this situation.

spasm present. The extremities were essentially negative. There was no loss of muscular power in either the flexors or extensors nor was there any muscular atrophy present anywhere.

Laboratory:

Routine urinalysis - essentially negative. Complete blood count: hemoglobin 11 gms. RBC, 3,850,000, WBC 5,150. Hematocrit 33. Differential count: Neutrophils 53%, Monocytes 3%, Lymphocytes 42%, Eosinophils 2%. Toxic granulation 3+. Basophilic stippling 28/2500 RBC. Lead blood 138 micrograms %.

Summary and Conclusion:

This 52-year old employee, working for your company for the past five years has been found to have elevated lead blood determinations. He has no symptoms at present of an active case of lead intoxication. However, the work-up as detailed above reveals that he has definitely absorbed a good deal of lead and is an impending case of lead intoxication as evidenced by his anemia, increased stipple cells and elevated lead blood on several occasions.

I would remove this man immediately from his present occupation and not permit him to work until the above tests have returned to normal. I would suggest that another blood count and lead blood examination be performed in about three weeks.

Gentlemen:

On June 15th, 1971 I examined the above captioned employee as requested by your plant because a recent lead blood determination was found to be very high. Mr. [REDACTED] told me that he has been working for the Mac Gregor Lead Company from 1966 to the present time and that his occupation is that of a ball mill machine operator.

History:

At the time of his examination he denied any complaints or any symptoms. He told me that he has never had lead intoxication in this or any other plant. He did give me a history of cataract surgery in his left eye in January of 1971. An inventory of symptoms by systems revealed no weakness, loss of weight or joint pains, but he did say he occasionally had some headaches and dizziness. There was no loss of appetite, colic or constipation. There were no tremors, neuritis, convulsions or muscular weakness or insomnia.

Physical Examination:

Physical examination revealed a very well-nourished, colored male 6' tall, weighing 277 lbs. Examination of his eyes revealed a chalazion on the left upper lid. Vision of the right eye was 20/25, left eye 20/30. Examination of the mouth revealed mild pigmentation of the gums frequently seen in people of the black race, but I could not make out a definite lead line. The teeth were in fair condition, and there was no gingivitis present.

The heart and lungs were normal. His blood pressure was 142/90. The abdomen was soft, obese and non-tender with no
