Citizens Committee to Begin Studying P.G.'s School Needs

A citizens committee formed to junior high school campus and study school needs in Pacific Grove will hold its first study session Thursday evening.

The meeting, open to the public, will be held in the school board room at 716 Lighthouse Ave.

The citizens committee was formed at an organizational meeting last week. Its study is expected to be a prelude to a bond election, possibly before the end of the year, for new construction in Pacific Grove Unified School District.

Depending on the findings of the committee, district trustees may seek approval of a bond issue well in excess of half a million dollars.

The money would be used for construction of a new elementary school, additional buildings at the

other projects.

Determining what additional facilities the district needs, how soon they will be needed, and how present facilities can best be utilized will be the committee's job.

Supt. Thomas Turner told the committee at its organizational meeting that the district will be faced with providing accommodations for close to 100 additional students each year, starting with the coming year.
