Dear Ray:

I have no doubt Mr. Roberts has told you about the situation at the Braden Copper Mine. He has probably also told you some time ago that we visited the mine, consulted with the Braden people about all of the details of the use of tetraethyl lead, and after some considerable discussion developed mutually acceptable plans for going ahead. It now appears that they will not get around to the use of lead for purposes of flotation for quite some time, but I see no reason why they can not use it satisfactorily from an hygienic point of view whenever they wish to do so. Roberts has sent along to me blue prints outlining their general plans for equipment. I am forwarding these to you for your information at Robert's request. He has just returned to the United States and I imagine he will give me additional blue prints, but if not at this time, subsequently. Accordingly these are for your use.

If any questions occur to you in connection with this general subject, or if there is any specific information which you wish which I can give you, please let me know. We have assumed, however, that if this general set-up is satisfactory to Roberts and to me, you would be satisfied merely to be informed of what takes place.
