Plastics Firms' Group Asks Court to Stay Vinyl Chloride Ruling

NEW YORK—The Society of the Plastics Industry Inc., a trade association, moved to get the U.S. Supreme Court to decide whether workers' exposure to vinyl chloride monomer gas should be reduced to a fiftieth of current standards.

The society said it asked the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit to stay its Jan. 31 decision upholding a ruling by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration. The ruling would require vinyl chloride producers to cut worker exposure by April 1 to one part of gas per million parts of air from a temporary emergency standard, still in effect, of 50 parts per million.

Long-term exposure to the gas, which is the raw material for the widely used polyvinyl-chloride plastics, has been linked to a rare but fatal liver cancer.

The society, in asking for the stay, said it intended to apply for a writ of certiorari within 20 days to get the dispute before the Supreme Court. The group, joined in its initial appeal by eight manufacturers, claims the reduction in worker exposure is "technologically and economically infeasible" and isn't necessary on the basis of existing medical evidence.

Halliburton Unit Planning Facility to Fabricate Decks

HOUSTON—Brown & Root Inc., an engineering-construction subsidiary of Halliburton Co., said it plans to establish a facility in the Corpus Christi, Texas, area to fabricate steel structures and decks for offshore oil and gas production.

The concern initially will operate from company-owned property at Ingleside, Texas. For the time being, fabrication of deck sections will be the primary function of this operation.

At the same time, the company will begin preparation of a 300-acre site at Aransas Pass on the Corpus Christi Ship Channel. It is estimated that the Harbor Island fabrication yard will be ready for production of jackets and decks by the first quarter of 1978.

"Four years ago," said Delbert Ward, Brown & Root senior group vice president, "we bought the Aransas Pass property with the idea that additional Gulf of Mexico fabrication facilities would be needed to accommodate increased offshore activities of the oil and gas industry. With domestic energy reserves in a current state of short supply, the time has arrived to establish the new marine yard."
