Dear Mr. Dirck:-

I have just received a note from the Medical Section of the Ohio Industrial Commission requesting me to undertake a brief course of treatment and some further tests to determine what can be done for you by way of additional medical treatment. I suggest, therefore, that you make it a point to come to Cincinnati on either Monday or Wednesday, preferably Monday, of next week. If you wish at that time to come prepared to stay in the hospital for a while, I should be glad to make the necessary arrangements. If, on the other hand, you prefer to come and talk it over with me first and arrange your stay in the hospital at a little later date, that will be entirely satisfactory.

Shortly after I saw you I wrote to your Dr. Borelli, giving him my general opinions and making a few suggestions as to some treatment. I would appreciate it very much if when you come, you would bring me a note from him concerning the treatment which he has given, and expressing his opinion as to what he thinks might better be done by way of treatment. I should be glad to cooperate with him in any way I can so as to give you the best possible opportunity for recovery.
