Dr. Nahle featured in two ME/CFS Articles

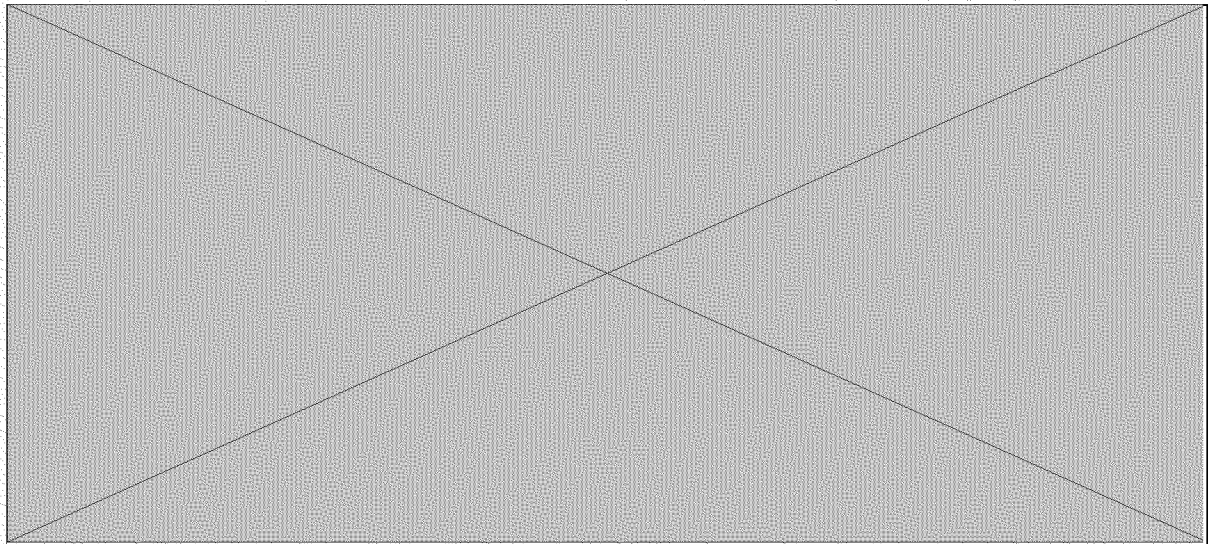
Dr. Zaher Nahle was recently featured in two articles highlighting recent ME/CFS advancements. The articles investigate the potential impact of the National Institutes of Health's (NIH) recent investment to fund three Collaborative Research Centers (CRCs) and a Data

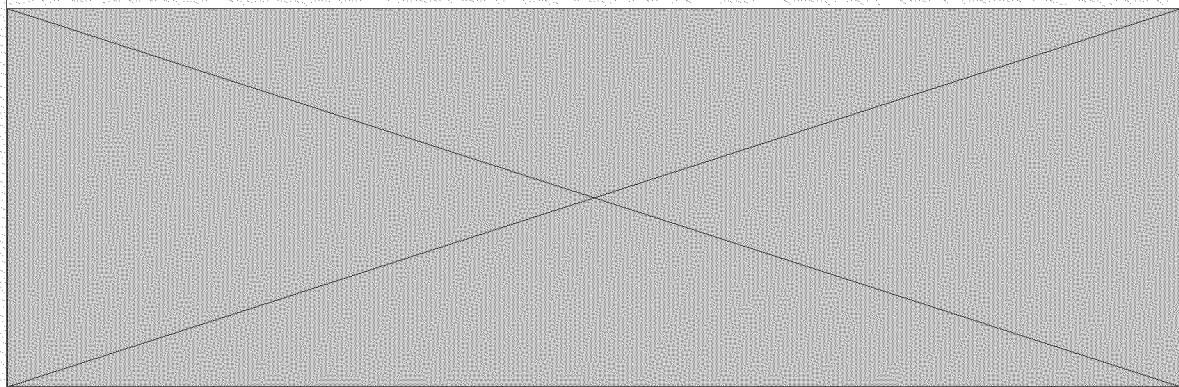
Dr. Nahle Attends International ME/CFS Conference in Sweden

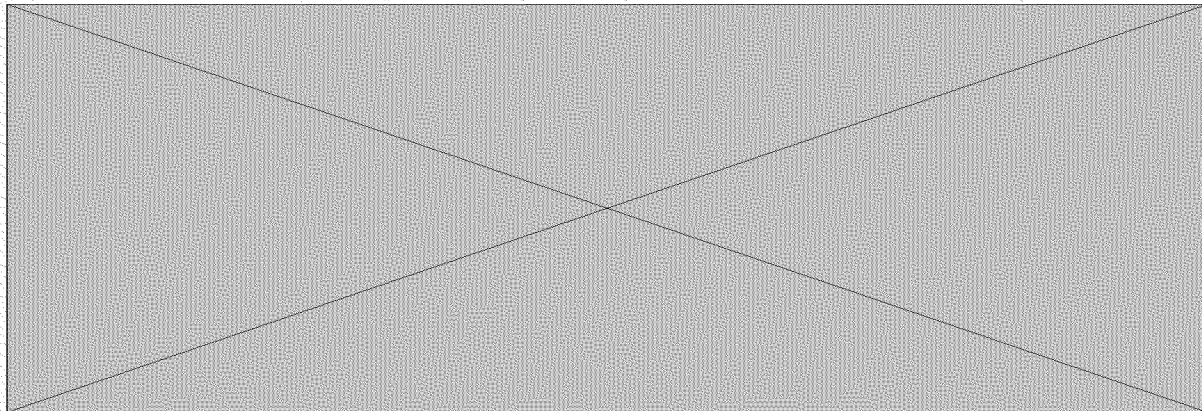


In case you missed it: 2017 Ramsay Research Grant Awardees
