Dear Manfred:

Just a note to indicate that there will be some further delay in the submission of a proposal for experimental work on lead. Two factors have entered into my delay:

(1) I have not had time to even consider the details, having had my nose firmly to the grindstone of other immediately urgent matters and dead lines.

(2) Having thought about the matters at odd intervals, I have been unable to see how the work can be initiated soon.
