Dear Joe:

The following is a summary of the safety activities in my territory for the week just ended.

IMPERIAL OIL LTD., MONTREAL EAST, QUE.

I spent about a day and a half observing the loading of 36/55 and 46/10 gal. drums of L.S.T. Fluid for return to Carney's Point, N. J. I was sure that the strapping they had on hand was not heavy enough for the purpose and insisted that they get heavier. We had to go to Montreal to the Canadian Steel Strap Co., Ltd. and ask them how heavy strapping we would need for the purpose and they advised using 7/8" x .035. I would like to hear how the shipment arrived at our plant.

I suggest that for those of us who do so little of this it would have been well to include in the safety manual more detailed description of loading, at least give the size of straps necessary to properly hold the drums in place.

MCCORMICK FUCHS OIL CO., LTD., MONTREAL EAST

I made the regular quarterly inspection of the mixing plants.

I discussed tank cleaning with authority and notification men and have sent in reports on them.

Later in the week I received an air mail letter from you enclosing and "A" sample report showing low induction period and since I was tied up on a tank cleaning job I had to take this up with them over the telephone. I have made a separate report covering A-12376.

They advised that they expected to have a tank cleaning job next week for the sales department near Montreal and would advise you later of the exact date.

BRITISH AMERICAN OIL CO., LTD., MONTREAL EAST

I made the regular quarterly inspection of the mixing plants. I also made out the permanent record for the EM plant.

Discussed tank cleaning with authority and notification men and have sent in the regular reports.

I discussed insufficient storage space for a carload of

I spent a little over two days observing the cleaning of
a tank which they wished to "load Area".

I called these people up on the telephone and discussed
winning and inventory statements with them because I was tied up on
the tank cleaning job and could not call personally. They promised
to send in the January statement at once. The November and December
statements they are going to check over and if necessary will send in
corrected ones. They believed that the Dec. report had a typographical
error in that the 9 and 7 were transposed and they should have showed
79,271 pounds used. Separate reports will be submitted on these.
