Purpose of the Meeting: The purpose of this meeting is to introduce Administrator Pruitt to the Waters Advocacy Coalition (WAC; the Coalition) and its diverse membership.

Background on the Meeting: The Waters Advocacy Coalition represents a large cross-section of the nation's economy including the construction, real estate, mining, manufacturing, forestry, agriculture, energy, recreation and public health and safety sectors, all of which are vital to a thriving national economy and provide much needed jobs.
