Dear Mr. Tatman:

Mr. Schaik has asked me to forward toxicity information on our product Fydraul 625.

I have enclosed a copy of our Fydraul F-9 bulletin and several pages of a circular entitled "Discussion and Interpretation of Fydraul F-9 Toxicity Studies". These are forwarded because of the similarity in composition of Fydraul F-9 and Fydraul 625 and to add background to the comparative data indicated below.

In animal studies designed to indicate skin and eye irritation potential, Fydraul 625 proved to be less irritating than Fydraul F-9. In acute vapor inhalation studies, rats survived 6-hour exposures to atmospheres saturated with vapors of either product.

The above comparisons are significant since Fydraul F-9 has been used since 1949 with no reports of skin irritation or other toxic effects. As pointed out on page 18 of the Fydraul F-9 bulletin, accidental contact of Fydraul F-9 with eye tissues may result in burning and smarting. This has been reported in a number of instances where the fluid has accidentally been splashed or sprayed in the eyes. In no case has there been any permanent damage to sight or eye tissues.

The question of toxicity of decomposition products usually arises in connection with these fluids. The enclosed "Discussion and Interpretation, Etc." points out that the toxicity of Fydraul F-9

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decomposition products when the fluid was dropped on heated surfaces is roughly comparable to that of the decomposition products of petroleum base fluids as far as short term massive exposures are concerned. In addition, similar comparisons may be made with other fire resistant fluids which have been in use for a number of years without any reports of toxic effects.
