COURSE DESCRIPTIONS**ASBESTOS**

Asbestos Abatement Supervisor 40 hour course required for people supervising asbestos abatement as a competent person according to 1926.1101 or planning to hold a Virginia Asbestos Abatement Supervisors license.

Asbestos Abatement Worker Required for people working on asbestos abatement projects or planning to hold a Virginia Asbestos Abatement Workers license.

Asbestos Project Designer This 24 hour course includes AHERA, industrial and commercial asbestos project designs. VA/EPA approved.

Asbestos Project Monitor 16 hour course for those who already hold a valid Asbestos Supervisors license or have passed the Asbestos Project Designer course. VA/EPA approved.

Asbestos Inspector 24 hour course covering AHERA, industrial, and commercial inspections and collection techniques. VA/EPA approved.

Asbestos Roofing, Siding, and Flooring 8 hour course for asbestos roofing, siding and flooring.

NC Roofing Worker 8 hour course required by North Carolina for removal of friable roofing materials.

NC Roofing Supervisor 16 hour course required by North Carolina for removal of friable roofing materials.

Asbestos Maintenance Worker/Supervisor and Class III & IV Competent Person 16 hour course for persons performing or overseeing persons who perform repair and maintenance of items containing asbestos products.

Custodial Worker 2 to 3 hour course for custodians in an asbestos O&M program.

VA/NC/EPA require asbestos updates annually. Refresher courses are VA/EPA approved, and are 8 hour courses.

LEAD PAINT ABATEMENT / INSPECTION

Lead Paint Abatement Supervisor/Designer 40 hour course that includes OSHA, EPA and HUD requirements for lead removal and waste control. VA/EPA approved.

Lead Paint Abatement Worker 16 hour course that includes OSHA, EPA and HUD requirements for lead removal and waste control. VA/EPA approved.

Lead Inspector Technician Three day course focusing on industrial, commercial, and residential building inspections, covering the XRF test method, bulk sampling, safety and reporting. VA/EPA approved.

Lead Inspector Risk Assessor Five day course focusing on industrial, commercial, and residential building inspections, covering the XRF test method, bulk sampling, safety and reporting. VA/EPA approved.

VA requires updates for lead every 3 years. Refresher courses are VA/EPA approved. Refresher courses are 8 hours.

OSHA COURSES

6 Hour Respirator For employers of employees who wear only air purifying respirators. This course will train you how to set up a comprehensive respirator program that will fit the needs of your organization, how to properly fit test your workers, and how to administer your program in accordance with the OSHA standards.

4 Hour Respirator For employers of employees who wear either an air purifying respirator and/or a supplied air respirator. This course will train you how to set up a comprehensive respirator program that will fit the needs of your organization, how to properly fit test your workers, and how to administer your program in accordance with the OSHA standards. The course is required in North Carolina for contractors with state contracts and approved by North Carolina.

The Respirator Program Administrator is required by OSHA of every employer whose employees wear a respirator in the workplace. Note, a dust mask that has two straps with four connections is considered a respirator by OSHA, and workers who wear them are required to complete a respirator program.

All classes begin at 8:30 a.m. unless otherwise noted.

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
