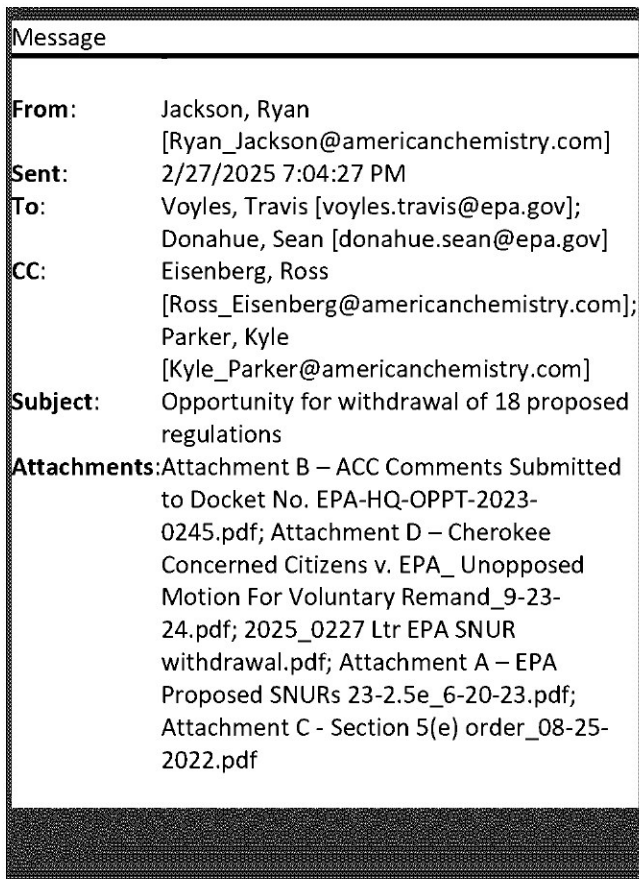




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Travis and Sean,

I wanted to forward a letter which we will send to the administrator suggesting the withdrawal of 18 proposed regulations.

The proposed significant new use rules from the Biden administration detailed in the attached letter and further attachments have and will continue to impede new innovations in advanced recycling projects which is a viable way to address plastic pollution and waste. Without these proposed regulations, re-manufacturing plastic through advanced recycling – instead of simply wasting it – strengthens our domestic supply chain, creates jobs, and reduces our environmental footprint.
