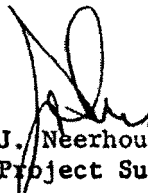

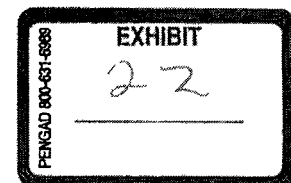
The subcontractor doing the insulation, AC & S, was employed by Bechtel under Contract 8633-M-70-HA.

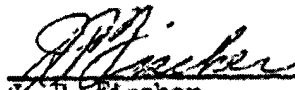
During the time when construction workers are insulating the No. 9 kiln ESP there is a considerable quantity of visible agglomerates of asbestos floating downwind of the area. Intermingled with the large agglomerates are finite particles which are not visible but which are trapped on a membrane filter. The fibers are generated when the asbestos or limpet is blown onto the equipment being insulated.

Sampling was done on two separate days and the fibers 5mm or longer were counted using a phase contrast microscope with results as follows:

2/21/72	Ground level 200 ft. N of headhouse	SE & SE	0.178
2/21/72	Headhouse, ESP floor, NE corner	S	0.296
2/23/72(0805)	Headhouse, ESP floor, NE corner	S	2.00
2/23/72(1015)	Same location	S	2.4
2/23/72(1315)	Same location	S	1.9

The measurements fall below the 5 particles/ml limit established by OSHA.

The large agglomerates are not caught in the filter.
