1- Frontal plate of the chest shows considerable general peri-bronchial increase throughout the lower two thirds, the apices being relatively clear. Apparently a chronic infectious process non-tubercular in origin. There is evidence of early bronchiectasis. Suggest lipidol for further information.

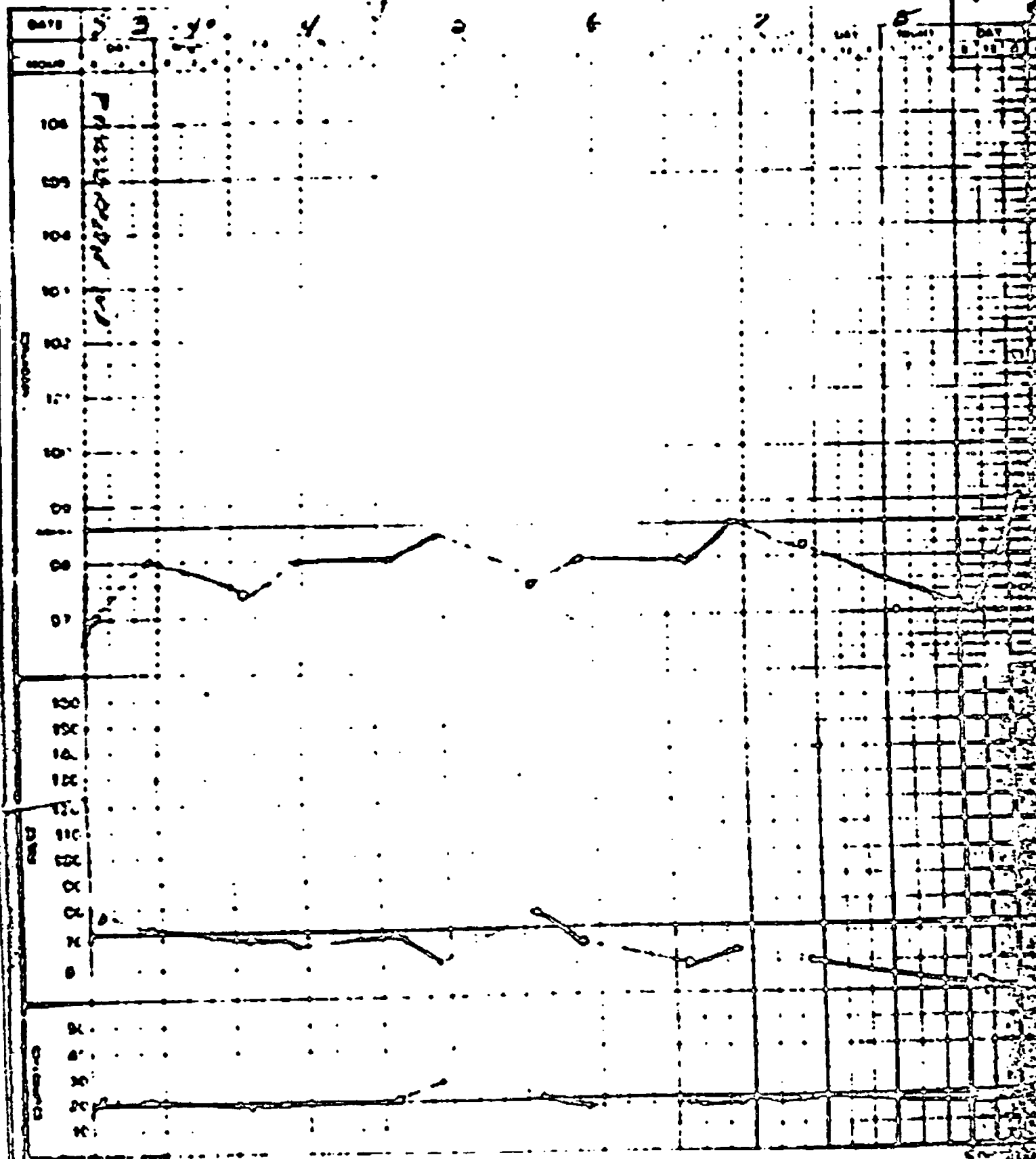
