NOTICE

TO EMPLOYEES OF AMERICAN CYANAMID COMPANY--CHICAGO PLANT:

Your employer, American Cyanamid Company, has filed an application with OSHA seeking a determination with respect to the Chicago plant's compliance with 29 C.F.R. § 1910.1025(e)(1), which requires the plant to implement engineering and work practice controls to the extent feasible to reduce ambient air lead levels to 200 micrograms of lead per cubic meter of air on an 8-hour time-weighted-average basis. The application seeks a determination that the Chicago plant has already implemented engineering and work practice controls to the extent feasible, but that these controls are unable to reduce ambient air lead levels to the 200 microgram level. We have asked OSHA to permit the continued use of respiratory protection in combination with all other controls in order to comply with 29 C.F.R. § 1910.1025(e)(1). In the alternative, the application requests a temporary variance and interim order delaying the deadline for implementation of feasible engineering and work practice controls.

Affected employees or their representatives are entitled to petition the Assistant Secretary of Labor for Occupational Safety and Health for a hearing concerning this application.

A copy of the application for the variance and interim order may be inspected at the Personnel Manager's office.
