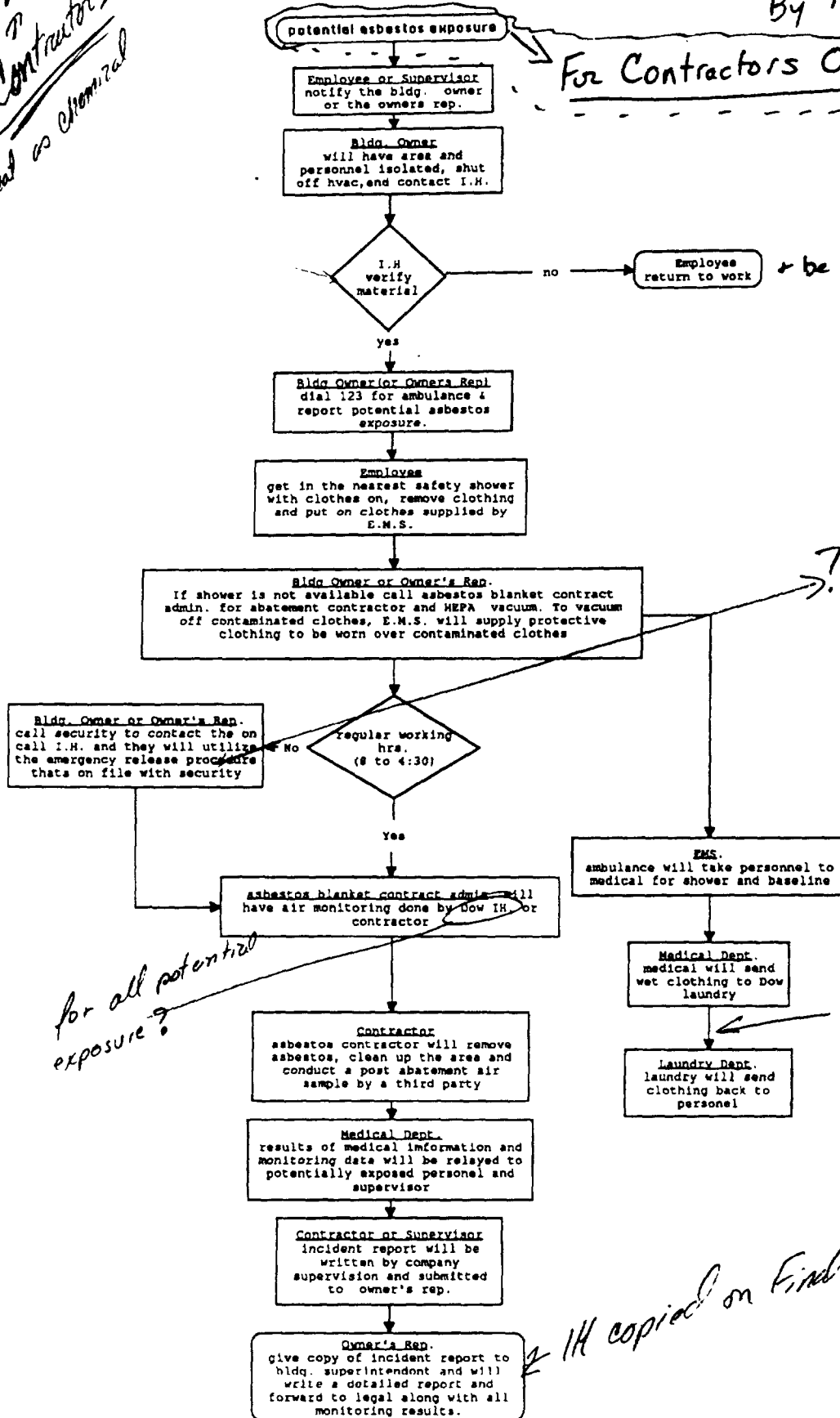

Asbestos Questioning

- 1) Asbestos is not an "acute" exposure problem.
A single massive exposure should be dealt with.
Small, incidental exposure should be noted.
- 2) If long term Dow liability is concern, then that should be platform communicated to superintendents. As "IH professional", I think theory of shower, strip, med treat, is overkill
- ③ If asbestos contaminates area, this would be done only by "accident". Any other work with asbestos would be permitted and done with proper enclosures. If "accident" occurs, immediate response is to evacuate the area. If ^{employee} exposure ~~that~~ suspected, report to medical.
Maybe distinction here is Dow employee "in area" vs. contractor conducting work.

Asbestos "exposure" policy should be for contractors only?
