Dear Bob:

At the meeting held April 17th in Washington on the subject of increasing the TEL level in the Federal specifications and also increasing the permissible concentration of TML to equal that of TEL in civilian gasoline, you suggested that our next step should be a discussion with the Office of the Surgeon General of the U. S. Public Health Service relative to the findings on TML. This discussion was to be deferred until you had been able to gather together the West Coast information into a suitable report that could be left with the U. S. Public Health.

We have had several requests for an increase in the concentration of mixed alkyls and "Tetramix" and we are wondering when we might expect to have your report ready for discussion in Washington.

Relative to your letter of May 25th transmitting the paper which you gave at the APCA, I would appreciate receiving three additional copies if these are available. With respect to the Harben Lectures, I agree that you should send copies to John Zapp, Allen Fleming and Stu Rankin and I would like to add Dr. W. Garret Hume of the Chambers Works. I believe that with this coverage within the Company we will be well covered.
