Dear Bob:

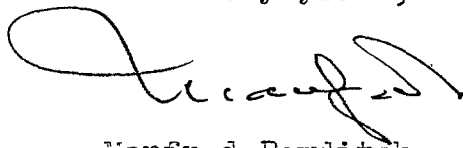
Herewith is a reprint of an article on lead poisoning of cattle, which was among a considerable file of items awaiting my attention upon my arrival here.
