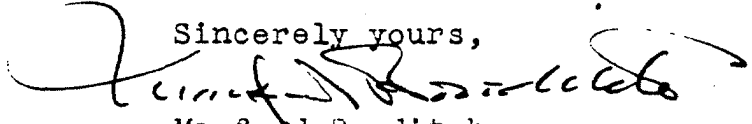

Information received since June 20 indicates that, in addition to the committees of several other organizations mentioned in my letter of that date, the A.M.A. Council on Industrial Health and the A.A.I.P. and S. have committees working along lines similar to ours. This appears to make it all the more imperative that there be full interchange of views between these committees, with perhaps, in due course, a meeting at which each is represented, in order that an epidemic of unrelated and probably conflicting reports may be avoided. Dr. Shepard's letter to Mr. Ingram is certainly constructively cooperative, and I hope that Dr. Hussey will find it possible to confer with Dr. Selby to ascertain the extent to which the latter's views agree with Dr. Shepard's.

Apropos Mr. Ingram's terminological discussion, and with full expectation that a Jovian bolt will descend upon me for my temerity, I would like to suggest that "Occupational Health" makes far more sense than "Industrial Hygiene" ever did.*
