

...men, including the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt, who was carrying out national policies, and he added that the "Air Forces must be considered of primary importance in this respect."

Symington announced further:
1. The War Department has assigned to the Air Forces all Army research and development of guided missiles, for which responsibility had been shared with the Army Ordnance Department.

2. The Air Forces and the Air Transport Association have set up a joint committee to correlate civilian and military plans. The new five-cent Airmail postage rate, Symington said, will require probably 1,500 planes as mail carriers, and these he noted, can carry troops and supplies as well.

SIMILAR TO DREAMBOAT
Symington said the planes in the proposed round the world flight would comprise a group of from eight to 24 Superfortresses of the same type as the "Pacusan Dreamboat" which flew from Honolulu over the Arctic to Cairo last weekend.

He said the route to be followed would be by way of Cairo, India and the Pacific.
