While I am aware of your plan to discontinue your services for Lead Industries Association shortly, I am asking for some information which you seem likely to have, and if you can provide it I'll be most grateful.

Dick Love, an insurance man, Insurance Incorporated, of Los Angeles, consulted me a little while ago, and among other things asked whether any films, designed to indoctrinate employees in dangerous lead trades in attitudes and performance, in relation to their safety and health, had been prepared and made available. I know only of a film devised by Ethyl Corporation, which relates specifically to the alkyl-lead compounds, and it would not be suitable. I would suppose that some other company may have put together such a film in relation to work involving inorganic lead, and if such a thing has been done, you would be likely to know about it.

Anything you can tell me, directly or for following up, would be useful. Mr. Love appears to be a straightforward person who would like to improve some of the situations which he encounters, and I would be pleased to encourage him.

I'll be glad to know your address in England when it is available, and my best wishes go with you. This goes with the greetings for the Holidays, also.
