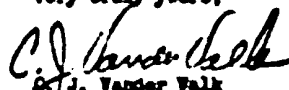

I am writing you at this time with further reference to my letter of November 25, because the minutes of the Red Lead Technical Committee meeting held on December 11 and 12 will not be ready for distribution for a couple of weeks and there are a couple of points that I thought you might like to know about promptly.

At the meeting certain changes in the stencopier exposure program, a copy of which was sent you earlier, were decided upon and the revised program will be sent to you soon.

Also it was decided to set a deadline - April 1, 1948, as the date not later than which the panels should be set out for exposure.

Cooperating companies will prepare the panels shortly and you should probably receive them around March 1.
