CHILDHOOD PLUMBISM

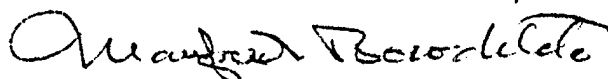
at the American Medical Association's 102d annual meeting, to be held in New York City from June 1st to 5th, 1953.
