Nitrate Rule

Dear Ryan Brandt:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that Chief Joseph RV Park (Mountain Man, LLC) has failed to conduct the required monitoring of nitrate water samples at facility/sample point(s) SS01/SP01. Samples were required to be collected between January 1 and December 31, 2024, and submitted to the Environmental Protection Agency according to 40 C.F.R. §§ 141.23 and 141.31 of the National Primary Drinking Water Regulations (NPDWR).

This is a violation of the NPDWR. If not already done, please take the following actions:

- (1) Collect all required nitrate samples as soon as possible for 2025 (for seasonal systems, as soon as the system is activated for the year). Monitor early in the monitoring period to help ensure results are submitted on time. Samples must be taken at every entry point to the distribution system which is representative of each well or surface water source for the drinking water system. Samples must be taken after treatment at the designated sampling points. Please see the attached Schematic Diagram of this system for your sampling point locations. If any changes have been made to the system or sampling points, please indicate those changes on the diagram, sign the diagram and send it back to the EPA.

- (2) Report sampling results to our office as soon as you receive them from the lab.
- (3) Public notification (PN) is required within one year of the violation or by December 31, 2025. You may use the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) as your sole PN delivery method if the CCR will be delivered prior to December 31, 2025. Otherwise, you must deliver a separate PN with your water bill or other mailing or direct delivery by hand. When a separate PN is used, it must still be included in your next available CCR. You may also create your own PN using the EPA Microsoft Word templates available at <http://www.epa.gov/dwreginfo/public-notification-templates-community-and-non-transient-non-community-water-systems>. Enclosed is a copy of the PN form.
- (4) If a separate PN is used, provide our office with a copy of your public notice and certification within 10 days of completion.

You should be aware that repeated violations of the NPDWR may result in formal enforcement action taken against your water system. If formal enforcement action were to be necessary, the Safe Drinking Water Act provides for civil penalties of up to \$71,545 per day of violation. We prefer to address problems before such formal enforcement is necessary, and we ask for your cooperation to rectify them quickly and effectively.

Instructions for Monitoring Violations Annual Notice – Template 3-1A

Template on Reverse

If you are required to provide Tier 3 notification, you must provide public notice to persons served within one year after you learn of the violation [40 CFR 141.204(b)]. Multiple monitoring violations can be serious, and your primacy agency may have more stringent requirements. Check with your primacy agency to make sure you meet its requirements.

Community systems must use one of the following [40 CFR 141.204(c)]:

- Hand or direct delivery
- Mail, as a separate notice or included with the bill

In addition, community systems must use another method reasonably calculated to reach others if they would not be reached by the first method [40 CFR 141.204(c)]. Such methods could include newspapers, e-mail, or delivery to community organizations. If you post the notice, it must remain posted until the violation is resolved. If the violation has already been resolved, you must post the notice for at least seven days [40 CFR 141.204(b)]. If you mail, post, or hand deliver, print your notice on your system's letterhead, if available.

The notice on the reverse is appropriate for insertion in an annual notice or the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), as long as public notification timing and delivery requirements are met [40 CFR 141.204(d)].

You may need to modify the notice if you had any monitoring violations for which monitoring later showed a maximum contaminant level or other violation. In such cases, you should refer to the public notice you issued at that time. If you do modify the notice, you must still include all required PN elements from 40 CFR 141.205(a) and leave the mandatory language unchanged (see below).

Mandatory Language

Mandatory language for monitoring and testing procedure violations [40 CFR 141.205(d)] must be included as written (with blanks filled in) and is presented in this notice in italics and with an asterisk on either end.

You must also include standard language to encourage the distribution of the public notice to all persons served, where applicable [40 CFR 141.205(d)]. This language is also presented in this notice in italics and with an asterisk on either end.

Corrective Action

In your notice, describe corrective actions you took, or are taking. Listed below are some steps commonly taken by water systems with monitoring violations. You can use the following language, if appropriate, or develop your own:

- We have since taken the required samples, as described in the last column of the table above. The samples showed we are meeting drinking water standards.

After Issuing the Notice

Make sure to send your primacy agency a copy of each type of notice and a certification that you have met all the public notice requirements within ten days after issuing the notice [40 CFR 141.31(d)].

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for [System]

Our water system violated drinking water requirements over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing (did) to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. 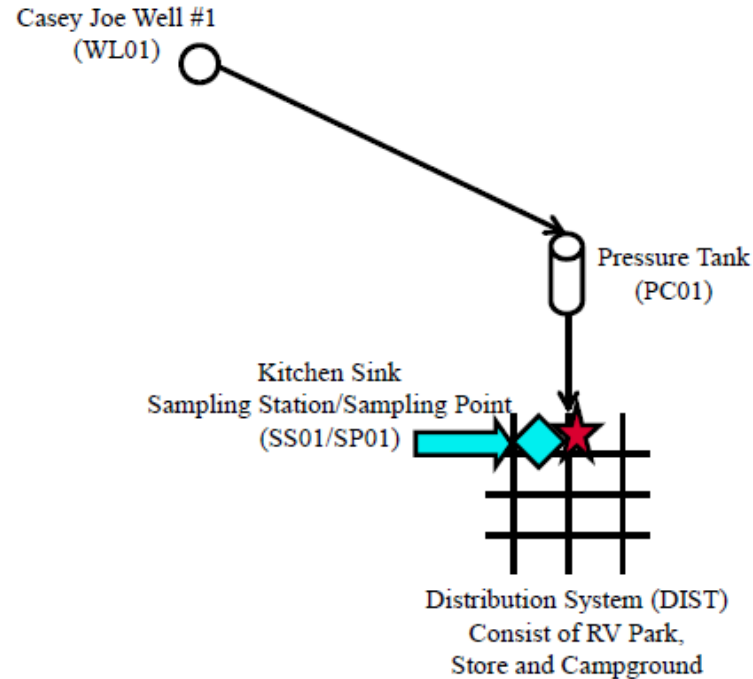
