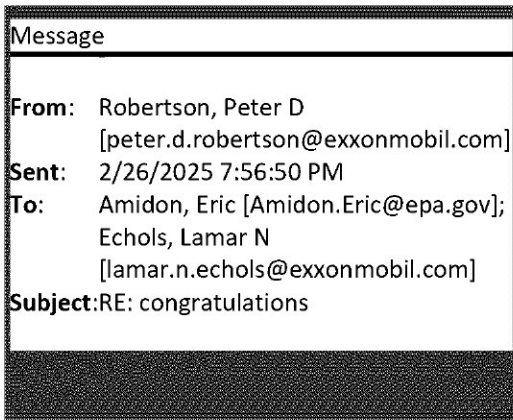

My name is Peter Robertson. I work for ExxonMobil, but this isn't a work-related email.
