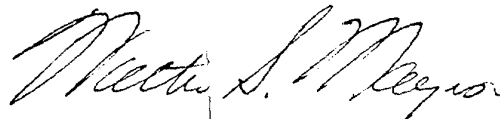
Attached is a letter from Mr. Charles R. ~~XXXX~~ Bell, of the firm Bell & Mueth, attorneys at law, Bowling Green.
