3. dust at claimant's home has caused problems
4. painted one kitchen door at home and had a reaction 1½ weeks prior to 4/28/84 appointment
5. pulmonary function test notes claimant very hyper about his work, breathing and most things in general - very nervous
6. PC from Union Hall Discount store (wife is employed at that location. I don't know why they would want a PC. The claimant had group coverage.
7. family history, mother chronic asthma and tuberculoma. Mother's uncle has asthma and hay fever.

Subpoenas will be sent out on information developed from Dr. Gray's records. Will also attempt to subpoena the mental health records.
