Dear Mr. Banash:

I was greatly pleased with your letter of December 14. I must confess, however, I am a little puzzled about the situation, because your impression of the report made by Greenburg and myself in the German publication coincides with practically all the reactions we have received. And yet there is so far as we are aware not an essential iota of difference between the report Greenburg and I presented and the report of the committee. Perhaps there is some subtle point that we have overlooked. But if you feel that the German report is unobjectionable, I feel pretty sure it would not be difficult to get that draft as it stands accepted as the committee report.

If on the other hand you desire to pursue the policy suggested in your letter there could be no possible objection from Greenburg and myself. The report is a printed document from which anyone has a right to make excerpts or to quote as extensively as they desire. I had rather, however, as I wrote you, function in any redrafting process only as one member of the technical committee and on the same basis as other members of that committee.
